One Great Week-We Couldn't Live Without It

Have you ever had an experience where the events of your life suddenly seem to pass before your eyes in a matter of seconds? Frequently, these incidents will elicit from us a sense of joy and longing to relive the good things that have happened in our lives. These dramatic flashbacks of memory might be triggered by something very simple: a delicious smell coming from the kitchen.

Often we seek to rekindle these strong memories and emotions through elaborately planned events: a Christmas tradition, a class reunion, a family vacation, a homecoming weekend. Much of the joy in these events is the shared experience of memory. We recall in these moments things which have made us who we are.

Each year we celebrate a week that commemorates the passion and resurrection of Christ. The observance is what we call Holy Week. It dates back to the fourth century Jerusalem and was known at that time as the Great Week. The days from Palm Sunday to Easter were spent in dramatized worship, with participants literally walking in the footsteps of Jesus. Preparation began weeks before as worshippers through prayer and fasting prepared to recount Jesus' death and resurrection.

We could not literally walk in the footsteps of Jesus as we celebrated Holy Week, but we had special occasions to remember and celebrate. Our Holy Week began on Palm Sunday with worship that included several musical pieces from the choir and children and youth choirs as well as the youth hand bell players. We are so appreciative of our choirs and their directors. On Thursday we gathered with other believers in Christ from Pisgah, Crowders Creek, Clover and Bethany ARP Churches for our annual Maundy Thursday service. This is always a wonderful gathering. "Maundy" comes from the Latin mandatum novum, referencing the new commandment Jesus taught His disciples (John 13:4). So this is also the new Commandment Thursday. In the history of the church the service has focused on three key areas of Jesus' last week of ministry: the institution of the Lord's supper, the washing of the disciples feet, and His new commandment to love one another.

Holy Week ended with the triumphant celebration on Easter morning as we gathered for an early service, breakfast, Sunday School and our Easter morning worship. Fifty days after the resurrection we celebrate Pentecost, the giving of the Holy Spirit and the birthday of the church. That one great week changed everything and we cannot imagine life without it!

~ Gastonia's Citizens on Patrol ~

They didn't fire the tear gas or talk to the gunman, but Bob and Sandy Harwell still had a part to play in a nine-hour standoff that brought the Gastonia Police SWAT Team to a quiet city neighborhood. The Harwell's are among four new members of Citizens on Patrol, an auxiliary arm of the Gastonia Police Dept. COP volunteers helped direct traffic during the April 2 standoff on South Marietta Street, freeing the police officers to focus on bringing the standoff to a peaceful end. "We were half a block away," Bob Harwell said. "We could hear the tear gas shots going off." Citizens on Patrol help stranded motorists, wait for tow



trucks to retrieve wrecked vehicles, direct traffic and do other public duties that do not require the presence of a law enforcement officer. They also serve as eyes and ears for Gastonia police, crossing the city in refurbished police cruisers marked as citizen patrol vehicles. "This program is so valuable to us as police officers because they can do so many of the things that officers can do," said Officer Amy Hawkins of the Crime Prevention Bureau. "It lets the citizens know that ordinary people can do so much in the community and assist the police department." Police Chief Tim Adams said letters, e-mails and phone calls praising the COPs have flooded his office.

Sunday School class members have taken meals to the homes of members to show that they care for them in the midst of their physical difficulties. Providing meals to others enables us to act as the hands and feet of Christ serving God's family. We're the body of Christ in action providing a tangible show of God's love and care in the time of need. All this is to say thank you to all the "care meal" providers. You are a blessing!
